MHI Partners with Rice University For 2019 Capstone MBA Project

Two teams of graduating MBAs began an intensive four-month study of Magnificat Houses starting in January, pursuant to presenting us with dual strategic business plans this May.

Annually, the highly selective Capstone Course of Rice University's Jones Graduate School of **Business brings** together seasoned



professors and masters degree candidates, clearly is the hardest part of being human, who train fresh eyes on the complex issues facing the chosen nonprofit organization.

Capstone's aim: developing recommendations to help community organizations

solve critical strategic challenges, such as major growth or expansion plans, organization turnaround strategies, and new ventures by the organization which could
