Record rainfall dampened the day—but not the spirits—at the groundbreaking for RoseMary's Place. Now construction has begun on our grounds pledged to serve Harris County's chronically unsheltered, in partnership with Coalition for the Homeless.

Thanks to all who made this auspicious occasion possible, the culmination of three years of creative planning , funding and partnership-forging across the many levels of local, state and

federal government, foundations, and my predecessor at MHI, John Boyles. We are grateful and want you all to enjoy knowing:

RoseMary's Place will stand on hallowed grounds—land made sacred by the thousands who have passed through Magnificat's doors, on this block alone, seeking refuge from the



streets. Made sacred by those workers and volunteers who came here daily to offer solace and comfort, along with a bed, clothing and meals, to every petitioner—regardless of who they were or what they'd done. Our focus was on what they could be.

Right now, right here, we're surrounded by what *is*, and what *was*, and what *will be*. What *will be* is RoseMary's Place, named in honor of our 99-year-old founder, Rose Mary Badami, who in 1968 set out "to get every homeless Houstonian off the streets as possible in my lifetime."

Housing

National data show unsheltered homeless in the U.S. has increased 30% since 2015. The number of homeless encampments have reached levels not seen in almost a century—Houston included. Magnificat has responded by rethinking our properties to provide maximum housing. Our emergency and temporary programs run from 1-90 days, providing stabilization while guests work toward creating an independent future.

Director of Housing Cynthia Rogers celebrates all incremental gains. "What seems small can be the vital step *this* individual needs to move on." For Ronald B., it was granting extra time for his application to truck driver's school to clear—it did, and he's off and running. He came back to offer thanks and hope to new applicants.

St. Joseph Clubhouse

Our Members share the joys and sorrows of everyday life, and form lasting friendships through our mental wellness programs. Special road trips happen too—like New Year's Day at NRG Stadium, where members mingled with staff and residents in prime seats near the 50 yard line, donated by ABB, a leader in automation and electrification.
