Holy Family Apartments Reopen to Welcome First SRO Tenants



On June 1, **John Escobedo** proudly unlocked the door to his new **Holy Family** apartment and stepped into the beautifully restored, significantly upgraded flat he'll call home. His reaction, "It's amazing."

With donor and volunteer help, MHI has been upgrading these six on-campus apartments over several months, rewiring, taking care of weather damage, adding all new appliances and bathroom facilities, buffing up the floors, resurfacing walls and ceilings and painting the exterior.

"Holy Family has been in continuous use since its acquisition in 1988—that's a lot of wear and tear," said **Victor Hay**, executive director. "We're restoring our properties now for the long haul, assuring they meet our standard for *dignified* housing."

MHI Hosts 'Homeless Street Outreach Festival'

St. Joseph House was action central on June 3 as two dozen homeless resource organizations, local dignitaries and citywide visitors converged on Austin Street to offer or receive homelessness services, share ideas and resources, and honor the organizer of this first Homeless Street Outreach Festival.

Organizer Officer Sheldon Theragood, a member of HPD's Homeless Outreach Team (HOT), wanted to "connect his homeless friends with resources and organizations." All along Austin, amidst the food trucks and entertainment, guests received needed counseling, haircuts, inoculations and rapid testing, while learning about City and MHI resources.

Considering Ofc. Theragood's significant contributions to Houston's neediest, Mayor Sylvester Turner proclaimed his

birthday, June 3, as **Sheldon Theragood Day.** The officer's nonprofit **TheraGood Deeds**, which puts youth on a path to community service, has also brought good will and resources to our guests at **Loaves & Fishes**.

SUCCESS STORY: MICHAEL WEBSTER

After years of struggling with drug addiction and months of homelessness, Michael came through Magnificat's doors knowing it was time to change. Completing his initial 90day term here, Michael volunteered to stay on to serve as a Peer House Leader at **Ave Maria House**, where he helped newcomers get their bearings, learn to participate in group meetings, reach out to support others and share housework. Saturdays, he



volunteered at our Anawim Thrift Store where he felt loved and appreciated, continuing even after he started a job.

On April 21, Michael returned to living independently, having found a job and an affordable apartment.

"Mr. Webster thanks the staff and supporters of MHI for affording him the opportunity of having shelter, a leadership role and all resources provided which helped motivate him to live a positive, drug-free life," reported Housing Director Cynthia Rogers. She called Michael "a model guest" as she handed him a Certificate of Appreciation.
